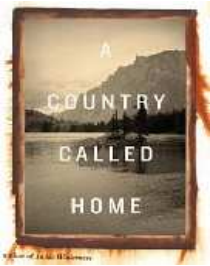

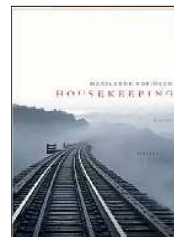

HOUSEKEEPING

The arrival of talented newcomers on the Northwest literary scene was made possible by a broader set of historical changes under way—the enormous growth of the regional population and economy beginning in World War Two; the integration of the region into the nation on more equal terms, and less strictly as a resource hinterland; the blossoming of such institutions as universities; the transformation of much (but not all) of the region into an industrialized and urbanized place; and the slow but steady growth of environmentalism, of appreciating the outdoors as something other than a source of extractive jobs. In short, the place was changing in ways that transformed its culture and, hence, encouraged the production of first-rate poetry, fiction, nonfiction, and drama.

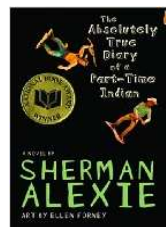

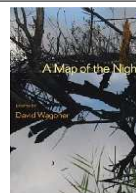

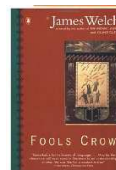
